

Any map chosen must maintain the City’s current sequence of two seats in the 2020 election and three seats in the 2022 election.

If the initial Mayoral election is in 2020, then one Council district will elect in 2020 and three Council districts will elect in 2022.

Where possible, districts with only a single resident current Councilmember, and districts with multiple resident current Councilmembers whose current terms all end in the same year, should be assigned election year sequences that match the resident Councilmember’s term. This approach allows the voters to decide which Councilmembers have earned re-election, rather than district lines blocking the voters from the opportunity to decide whether the Councilmember has earned re-election.

State law requires that proposed election sequence be posted for each map to encourage public discussion of this question, but the following proposed election years are open to change based on public feedback and the questions raised above.
